The Aston Martin DB3 was built almost exclusively for racing between 1951 and 1953, only 10 of them were ever made with the chassis numbers 1-5 going to the factory works team and chassis' 6-10 going to privateer teams in the UK.. The DB3 had a mixed bag of results but is most famous for claiming the checkered flag at the Goodwood 9 Hour Race in 1952.

### 1951 Aston Martin DB3 - (SILODROME)

It would take until September of 1951 before the first DB3 would take to the track during the Tourist Trophy at Dundrod. Lance Macklin ran as high as fifth before retiring with a damaged engine due to an oil leak. Minor modifications were carried through over the winter as the John Wyer run Aston Martin Team prepared for an all out assault in 1952.

Aston Martin built ten DB3's from 1951-1953. DB3/8 is thought to be one of seven DB3's left in existence, and the only DB3 left with all of its original body including the original grill. During the restoration particular attention was paid to preserving as much of the original parts as possible including rebuilding and fitting the original engine.
